

Lower numbers than expected


We are aware of several areas where local initiatives have been providing emergency food parcels during the lock-down period. We may see an increase as things start going back to 'normal' over the next months.

The agencies and partners that most of our referrals came from are:

Most came from Central Beds Council, **119** including Childrens Centres. Other agencies that sent us referrals, but not counted specifically include schools, job centres, welfare organisations, charities and churches.
