


"I was hungry and you gave me something to eat"

Need Project Report August 2020




In addition we gave out over 50 bags of essential items in the final week of July to families struggling with holiday hunger. We were also in a position to support a food charity which in the past had helped us greatly by giving basic items that we had surplus of.

The agencies and partners that most of our referrals came from are:

Yesterday my car was absolutely filled to the brim with food parcels, bags of clothes, shoes and bedding all from yourselves, which I delivered to 5 families within Hertfordshire.
