




Last month, I wrote that this project started over five years ago. Technically, that was true, but it missed the bigger picture. It has been operating for 13 years now, it was our records that spanned over five years. So it was started in 2008 with the vision and dedication of Gordon Hamilton, Project Leader. We've come a long way since then.

Only one month to go till our year end, and the figures remain high with an average of 305 per month. The average excludes the Christmas parcels, January being our busiest month, then April. No doubt some of this is directly impacted by the pandemic. The whole of this year has been during lock-down apart from a brief respite in the summer of 2020.
