The amount of food parcels delivered is up by 122 this month based on August 2024. In September 2023 we delivered 520 food parcels. This is an increase of nearly 39% in food parcels delivered this month.

This month with your help. We have managed to make a difference to 1,620 adults, 322 pensioners and 1,467 children. This includes our best before food that we give away.




Change in number of parcels 2021- 2024




