Although it's been a difficult year, as we aren't in our new building and we therefore we operated differently this Christmas, we still managed to do all that was required of us, and we hope everyone got what they needed. We gave away new toys, with an estimated value of £20,000.

This month with your help. We have managed to make a difference to 1,771 adults, 296 pensioners and 1,641 children. This includes our best before food that we give away.




Change in number of parcels 2021- 2024





The reasons people are being referred for food parcels & how many have a disability






