314 top-up-bags collected from our Pop-up sites.





In February 2024 we delivered 737 food parcels. This is an increase of nearly 23% in food parcels delivered this month vs the same month last year.

This month with your help. We have managed to make a difference to 1593 adults, 278 pensioners and 1,196 children. This includes our best before food that we give away..






Change in number of parcels 2021- 2025




